The Building Inspections Department, directed by the Rockwall City Council, has consistently worked to adopt the latest building codes to ensure both residential and commercial structures are constructed at the highest standards to help keep you safer.

The Insurance Services Office (ISO) provides advisory information to insurance companies about community efforts to mitigate property damage due to natural disasters. As a result, some companies may choose to offer discounts based on that information.

ISO analyzed the standards and practices of the City of Rockwall Building Inspections Department last fall, and has recognized Rockwall with a score among the top 2% of municipalities rated in Texas.

Love Your Landscaping... Let's Get Ready For Spring

Between the months of February and March there are a handful of steps to take to begin preparing your landscape for the upcoming growing season.

- Prepare your lawn by removing dead grass and leaves in early March
- Cut back roses, perennials and ornamental grass to prepare for new growth
- Apply pre-emergent herbicides in early February to prevent spring weeds
- Grass will begin growing when soil temperatures hit about 65 degrees
